FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



WILL MY CAMPER GET TO BE IN A CABIN WITH THEIR FRIEND? Cabin assignments are arranged by your school teachers, please see your child's teacher for any concerns about cabin assignments.

HOW ARE CABIN LEADERS SELECTED? Cabin leaders are selected by a school representative and all screening is done by the school.

WHERE WILL MY CAMPER STAY AT MICHINDOH? Our modern style cabins accommodate 12-14 people with bunk beds/mattresses, heat and AC, and an indoor bathroom with shower and restroom stalls.

AM I ABLE TO CALL MY CAMPER WHILE THEY ARE AWAY? We know it's difficult to be away from your child, we try to discourage phone calls for "just checking in" purposes as that can lead to a desire to go home. If you have a special concern, please reach out to your child's teacher to see what the plan of action can be there.

CAN I SEND MY CAMPER MAIL WHILE THEY ARE AT CAMP? Yes! Mail is highly encouraged - there are a couple of ways to send it. You can write a letter and put it in their suitcase for your child to find it. You can give that letter to the teacher on the day of departure. Or you can send it through the postal service (I'd send it at least a week in advance to ensure it makes it to camp when your student is there). Any mail received at camp or from the teachers is passed out during dinner. Snail Mail can be addressed like this:

WILL MY CAMPER BE ABLE TO TAKE THEIR MEDICATION AT CAMP? Yes, we highly encourage students to stay on their routine medications while at camp. Please make sure all medications are in the original container, marked clearly with the student's name and appropriate dosage, and turned in to the teacher on the day of departure. Our Health Officers handle all medication storage and distribution.

WHERE IS THE NEAREST HOSPITAL? Hillsdale Hospital is 5 miles from Camp.

WHAT DOES A TYPICAL DAY AT CAMP LOOK LIKE?

Here's a schedule of what a FULL day of Outdoor Education looks like: 7:30am Raise the Flag
7:45am Breakfast
9:15am – 11:30am Class 1 & 2 with travel time in between
12pm Lunch
1:30pm-3:45pm Class 3 & 4 with travel time in between
4pm Afternoon Activities
5:15pm Lower the Flag
5:30pm Dinner
7:15pm Evening Program
9pm Return to cabins to get ready for bed
10pm Lights out & quiet

WHAT KINDS OF CLASSES DO THE CAMPERS ATTEND? Classes at Michindoh are hands-on and interactive. Holding live animals in our Reptiles & Amphibians class, learning survival skills in our Outdoor Living Skills class, working together as a team in the Low Challenge Course, and using their creativity to make a Tie Dye shirt are some examples of what the students will be experiencing. Students are given the opportunity to encourage one another and work together as a team to accomplish goals/tasks. The teachers and Michindoh staff work together to pick classes that align with what students are learning in school.

IS MICHINDOH A PUBLIC PLACE? Michindoh is private property. We strongly discourage any random visitors; all appointments need to be made through the office. We have many staff that live onsite and are made aware of visitors that are scheduled.
